



PROTECT YOURSELF FROM MOSQUITO BITES: **DRAIN and COVER**

Preventing mosquito bites enhances your enjoyment of outdoor activities, and can protect you from exposure to Zika and all mosquito-borne illnesses. The Florida Department of Health reminds you to **DRAIN** and **COVER** to safeguard you and your family.

Mosquitoes can breed in as little as one teaspoon or a bottle cap of water. To stop mosquitoes from multiplying, **DRAIN** standing water from garbage cans, house gutters, pool covers, tarps, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.

Mosquitoes can bite any time of the day or night. **COVER** your skin with long sleeves and pants, and use mosquito repellent according to package instructions. Also be sure to **COVER** doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out.
